

Lakeside Aquatics Club smashes records at TAGS

Lakeside Aquatics Club, a swimming team based in Flower Mound, The Colony, Denton and Keller, had one of their best performances in club-history July 29-August 2 at the Texas Age Group Swimming Championships on the campus of Texas A&M University.

Lakeside finished sixth in the state as a team and set a TAGS record for an individual meet by breaking 19 team records. Lakeside's previous

top finish at TAGS was 17th.
"We had our best Long Course season ever this sum-mer," said Jason Walter, said Jason 14-and-under Lakeside's coach. "I am very excited to see how this season will act as a springboard for next season. Our kids raced with confidence and I know this success will pay off in the future."

Lakeside was paced by their 11-12-year-old division which finished second as a

Leading the way was Brendan Feehery, an 11-year-old from Flower Mound, who placed second overall in High Point for 11-year-old boys.

Feehery took first in the 100-meter backstroke (12th in the nation), first in 200 back

(sixth nationally) and first in 100 freestyle. He also took second in 50 back, second in 400 free (12th nationally) and sec ond in 200 free (13th national-

Feehery joined with Jerik Wong, Andrew Inoue and Michael Summers to set club records in the 400 free relay and 400 medley relay, while Feehery, Wong, Inoue and Aidan Glynn set team records in the 200 free relay and 200 medley relay.

Wong, from Flower Mound and competing in the 11-12year-old division, finished in the top 8 in each of his seven events. He just missed the TAGS championship title in the 50 breaststroke (36.67 sec

onds) after being out-touched. Nine-year-old Matthew Willenbring also had a big meet too, finishing fourth meet too.

overall in his age group Willenbring finished first in 100 breaststroke (team record), second in 50 breast-stroke (team record), third in 200 individual medley (team record), third in 200 free (team record) and third in 400 free (team record).

Austin Leih, Patrick Nolan and Cameron King teamed up with Willenbring to set records in the 200 free relay (fourth place), 400 free relay (second and 200 medley relay place) (fifth place).

es at TAGS, placing in the top 8 in 200 free, 400 free and 100 backstroke. He set personal bests in six of his seven events.

Mound's David Arredondo brought back four medals, finishing fourth in the 100 butterfly, fifth in 200 fly, seventh in 200 free and eighth in 400 free. He also set a team record in 800 free finishing ninth (9:23.40), which had stood since 1997.

Weber. Lakeside's Leah Weber, competing in the girls 14-andunder division, took sixth in 100 breaststroke, third in 400 medley relay and fourth in 200
